REPORT: The Hunt for Disrupted Brain Signals

Behind Autism

"Studies in mice suggest circuitry role for missing gene." "Part of understanding the underlying causes of autism spectrum disorder relies on figuring out which cells' signaling patterns in the brain are disrupted, and when during nervous system development the disruption occurs. New research findings in mouse models of one genetic risk for autism support the idea that loss of a specific gene interferes with cells in the brain whose role is to inhibit signaling."

"We hoped to provide clues for whether or not we might consider therapies for autism that could be fixable across the whole brain if we tweaked a single gene," he said. "Unfortunately, we found it's not likely. Autism risk genes are not concentrated in a specific group. But we did find many among inhibitory neurons, suggesting they are potentially key targets for therapeutics."

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

REPORT: Analysis of Neurodevelopmental Disorders in Offspring of Mothers With Eating Disorders in Sweden

Question: Are children of mothers with eating disorders at increased risk of developing neuropsychiatric diseases?

Findings: In this nationwide cohort study of 52,878 children, including 8,813 children born to women with an eating disorder and 44,065 matched children born to women without an eating disorder, maternal eating disorder was significantly associated with attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder and autism-spectrum disorder in offspring.

Meaning: These findings highlight the importance of clinical awareness and intensified support to women with eating disorders and their children and for future research efforts to identify underlying mechanisms of the association.
