DREAM FUND

Deadline: July 7

You're eligible for Dream Fund bursaries if:

- >You are youth in or from care in BC ages 14-24
- You have a cumulative total of one year in government care (CCO, VCO, TCO, SNA, YAG, Extended Family Placements)
- (Education Achievement only) You are enrolled or planning to enroll in a secondary, post-secondary academic, technical or vocational program, a recognized public post-secondary institution, or a registered private post-secondary institution. The school does not need to be in BC.

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
