The Safe Babies Foster Parent training is an educational program for those interested in becoming caregivers of children under the age of 3 who have been exposed prenatally to drugs and/or alcohol. Foster Parents, Caregivers, MCFD/Delegated Aboriginal Agency staff and community partners who work with Safe Babies homes are welcome. This training will be facilitated by the Support To Family Care Network Team and guest presenters for each module. **You must attend all 9 sessions to receive your Safe Babies certificate.** CPR-C (Infant CPR) is also required to be Safe Babies certified.

RISE GRANTS: Resilient, Inspire, Strength and Engage

Getting active and creating life changing experiences for Children and Youth in and out of Care. The RISE Grants will support ALL Children and Youth in and out of Care, who wish to participate in a sport, physical activity, recreation, and/or cultural program opportunity. If you can answer YES to the following, PLEASE APPLY:

- ↳ I currently live in British Columbia
- ↳ I am Under 27 years of age. (Born in 1996 or later as of December 31, 2022)
- ↳ I am/was formally enrolled in one of the B.C. Ministry of Children and Family Development or Delegated Aboriginal Agency Legal Status, or the Ministry of Social Development and Poverty Reduction Child in Home of Relative program
- ↳ I will use the funding to support my participation in sport, physical activity, recreation and/or cultural programs.

*Legal Statuses include: Adoption, Continuing Custody Order with a Director, Extended Family Plan, Interim Custody Order with a Director, Interim Custody Order with person other than a parent, Permanent Transfer of Custody Order with person other than a parent Special Needs Agreement, Temporary Custody Order, Temporary Transfer of Custody Order, Under the Guardianship of a Director – Adoptions Act, Under the Guardianship of a Director – Infants Act, Voluntary Care Agreement, Youth Agreement

Grants of up to \$1,000 per individual per calendar year may be used to support one or more of the following:

- ↳ Program Fees - Participant/Registration fees for organized sport, physical activity, recreation, and cultural activities.
- ↳ Equipment Cost - The purchase of equipment to support a program activity including but not limited to: sport equipment required to participate, activity shoes, sport accessories, or other specialized clothing
- ↳ Travel Cost – Accommodations are not eligible.

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
