FAMILYSMART: SUPPORTING SAFETY AT HOME WHEN YOUR CHILD HAS A MENTAL HEALTH CRISIS

Join us in watching a video with Lu Ripley, Director of Community Learning and Engagement at the BC Crisis Centre and Tammy Music, FamilySmart Parent Peer Support Worker at Surrey Memorial Hospital's Child & Adolescent Psychiatric Stabilization Unit as they discuss how to talk to your kids about safety. Safety concerns can include suicidal thoughts, self-harming behaviours, increased reactivity or aggression and any situation where you or your child is concerned about staying safe at home.

Come together with other families to watch this 35 minute video presentation and stay for a facilitated discussion by a FamilySmart Parent Peer Support Worker. Choose one from 3 days:

PARTICIPATE IN FASD CONSULTATIONS

The Canadian Academy of Health Sciences is undertaking an assessment on FASD and is seeking individuals with FASD, families and caregivers and related organizations to take part in consultations.

These consultations are intended to shape the direction of FASD policy going forward so it is vital to have as many people involved as possible. This work is funded by the Public Health Agency of Canada.

- ✳ Prevention – How can FASD prevention activities be strengthened to support the overall objective of reducing the prevalence of FASD in Canada?
- ✳ Supports - What tools, resources and supports are needed to improve outcomes for those with FASD across the life course?

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
