The Office of the Representative for Children and Youth invites you to an **update session** in follow-up to the engagement sessions that have informed a systemic review of the child welfare system in British Columbia.

UPDATE SESSION

Who: We invite all those who are interested in the systemic review: experienced practitioners, caregivers and foster parents, advocates, team leaders, program managers, clinical supervisors, executive leaders and others committed to supporting positive change in outcomes and well-being of children.

What: We're grateful to all your input so far and would like to share an update about the preliminary key findings from the systemic review, as well as provide an opportunity to review the emerging recommendation areas.

BACKGROUND

The Representative for Children and Youth is conducting an investigation into the circumstances that lead to the tragic death of a young child who experienced horrific abuse while in care and living in an out-of-home care arrangement. This child's and their family's story illuminate a number of issues within the B.C. child welfare system that the RCY has also identified through other reviews.

Alongside the story harvest (investigation), the RCY is undertaking a systemic review, with the intention of providing valuable insights and recommendations for child welfare reform. The investigation and systemic review will be completed and made publicly available by summer of 2024.
