"This past Tuesday, November 4, the government released the Federal Budget 2025. Disability Alliance BC (DABC) has compiled a summary of the items relating to people with disabilities. Most notably, the Budget mentions a one-time payment of \$150 to individuals applying for or renewing the Disability Tax Credit (DTC), making the Canada Disability Benefit (CDB) more accessible. NEW STUDY FINDS CHILDREN WITH ADHD ARE MORE LIKELY TO STRUGGLE WITH MOTOR SKILLS

ADHD is typically associated with symptoms like impulsivity, hyperactivity, and trouble with focus. But a **new review of studies** strengthens our understanding that kids with ADHD may also struggle with motor skills. These are the skills that let people move, control, and coordinate their movements.

Here's what you need to know and how you can help your child.

What the study found

This new review of studies was recently published in the Journal of Autism and Developmental Disorders. It reviewed 25 studies that included kids with ADHD and kids without.

Combined, the 25 studies included over 2,000 children between the ages of 5 and 14 years. Almost half of the children had ADHD, and the rest did not. It's the first time a review compared motor skills in kids with ADHD and neurotypical children. This comparison allows us to better understand the unmet needs of kids with ADHD.

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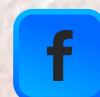
